

When you're watching a movie you've seen before and one of the hard parts come on the screen (the protagonist dies, the villain does something villainy, etc.), do you watch it? Or do you look away or even fast forward through the difficult scene and get to something a little more enjoyable?

I've learned that the difficult scenes actually help me appreciate what happens next. The challenging-to-watch parts actually help me appreciate the growth of the character or the end result more because I endured the challenging scene. For example, I appreciate Simba's courageous stand at the end of "The Lion King" because of the difficult scene earlier in the movie (no spoilers given here!). And I cheer for the heroes in the "Harry Potter," "Marvel," and "Star Wars" franchises more because of the challenges they endured.

In a few weeks we begin the Christian season of Lent, when we are invited into the story of Jesus' sacrificial death. Like watching a challenging scene in a movie, it can be very tempting to look away. Jesus' suffering and dying is very uncomfortable. However, when we take time to gaze at the cross and all that it means for us as followers of Jesus, the empty tomb on Easter morning has much greater meaning.

This year during our midweek worship services throughout Lent, we will be examining chapters 14 and 15 of the Gospel of Mark, which detail Jesus' Passion (the final period of Jesus' earthly life as a human.) In addition, a team of Trinity Lutheran staff have written devotions based on those two chapters in Mark. You will be receiving those devotion books as we get closer to Lent.

Throughout Lent, I encourage you to allow yourself to fully engage in the Passion of our Savior. You may be tempted to look away or fast forward to the empty tomb. I encourage you to look deeply at the incredible act of love on the cross. Yes, it will be difficult. But, oh, the joy we will have when we celebrate the empty tomb together!

One last thing- you may have noticed that Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, falls on February 14 this year. What a perfect day to begin our journey of remembering the greatest act of love in the history of the world! (John 3:16)

I look forward to traveling this journey with you.

LENT & EASTER SCHEDULE



Friday, January 26th marked the end of our week-long National Lutheran Schools Week celebration. Even though it turned out to be a short week, it was still filled with activities that celebrated the values of THIS LUTHERAN SCHOOL. Namely, activities that brought students closer together, activities that focused on serving those outside of ourselves, and activities that were just plain fun and brought joy. As we prepared for this celebration, I asked our Enrollment Coordinator, Christina Hansen, to collect data on what some of our new families thought about this Lutheran School. Christina has collected feedback and input over the last two years from new families and visitors. I'd like to share her input with you as we bring this 2024 National Lutheran Schools Week to a close.

I asked Christina, 'Why do families choose TLS?'. Here is the information she shared—verbatim.

Being Known

"Families love that in our approach to well-roundedness, we look at each student as a unique child of God, get to know them as people, and give attention to their individual strengths and weaknesses. They love that we have Chapel Buddies, Lunch Buddies, and Family Groups so that their children get to make connections throughout the entire school with both fellow students of different grade levels and staff. That everyone-knows-everyone and a Big Family feel really resonates.

Church Support

Many prospective families not only appreciate the fact that the church supports us financially, but also that so many church members take the time to volunteer, connect with, and encourage students. When touring families see reading volunteers, lunch ticket takers, and other volunteers, it makes them very happy, and many then ask if they can be involved after enrolling, too.

Family Involvement and Support

Families love seeing that we not only embrace the children whom they enroll here, but the entire family. They are excited to join a school community that's a giant extended family, as well as to learn that they can volunteer and they are welcomed to be involved in both their child(ren)'s educations and the school as a whole.

Peace, Joy and Warm Welcomes

Hardly anyone asks about test scores anymore (even though ours rock), but almost everyone comments on how amazed they are at how peaceful our school feels, how happy everyone is to be here, the warm welcomes they receive from staff and students alike, and our kiddos' willingness to include visiting children and share the things they love most about school.

Staff Dedication and Longevity

When families walk around the school and interact with teachers, administrators and support staff, the uncommonly high level of dedication we have for our school and families is very apparent. People are beyond delighted to learn that we very rarely lose staff members to anything other than retirement... and that once retired, many of those former staff return as volunteers. It speaks volumes.




